TCSC REQUEST FOR PUBLIC SECTOR STATISTICS

Paragraphs 17 to 20 of Mr Battishill's submission to the Chancellor of 5 June (on the TCSC study of long-term public expenditure trends) proposed how we should go about responding to the TCSC request for a formidable number of statistics covering the past ten years and the next ten years. The TCSC's letter is attached for reference. Miss O'Mara's note of 7 June indicated that the Chancellor was content with the proposals.

2. Mr Battishill's letter to the Clerk of the TCSC of 27 June said that work on the historical figures was in hand and that future year figures supplied would be of Cmnd 9143 origin and therefore not go beyond 1986-87. He said "we shall aim to provide as much information as possible, by the end of June or very soon after.".

### CONFIDENTIAL

3. We have now prepared a set of tables to send to the TCSC. They are enclosed, together with a rather lengthy draft covering letter giving the statistical sources and methods, some points of interpretation and reasons why we are not supplying everything the TCSC asked for. The letter is inevitably rather technical and is mainly directed at the Committee's specialist advisers who presumably will be working on the figures, rather than the Committee itself.

4. Bearing in mind the intended readership, the covering letter is, I hope, self explanatory; there are two particular points to which I draw your attention:-

a. the usefulness to the TCSC of the tables derived from Cmnd 9143 on current and capital spending is impaired by the DOE's continued refusal to show a breakdown of the housing programme for 1985-86 and 1986-87 (paragraph 6);

b. we have refrained from providing a cyclical analysis of the figures (paragraph 9VIII).

5. I would be pleased to have approval for Mr Battishill to send the attached letter to the TCSC with the accompanying tables. I understand the Clerk is holding up circulation of Mr Battishill's letter of 27 June to the Committee until he receives the tables, so they can be circulated together.

I am writing to you again concerning the Committee's data requirements for their enguiry into Long-Term Trends in Resources and Public Expenditure.

The Committee's preferred data set covering the last ten years and extending ten years forward is as follows:

a) Value added in the public sector (in real terms and as % of GDP)

b) Value added in the central government sector (in real terms and as a % of GDP)

c) Value added in the local government sector (in real terms and as a % of GDP)

d) Value added in the nationalised industries (in real terms and as a % of GDP).

II Consumption or current spending on goods and services (broken down also into wages and procurement) in real terms and as a % of GDP. Total and disaggregated by sector, programme and Department.

III Gross and net capital spending on goods and services (broken down also into wages and procurement) in real terms and as a % of GDP. Total and disaggregated by sector, programme and Department.

- IV Public Sector "non-exhaustive" spending (transfers, subsidies and grants). In real terms and as a percentage of GDP. Total and disaggregated by sector, programme and Department.
- V Public Sector employment. Total and as a % of the working population or labour force. Disaggregated: blue-collar, white collar and skill-composition. Also disaggregated according to programme and Department.
- VI Debt service. In real terms and as percentage of GDP.
- VII Receipts, broken down by category; in real terms and as a percentage of GDP. This would include tax and rates.

VIII Cyclical aspects of the behaviour of I-VII.

We recognise that statistical gaps will be inevitable since some of the historical data simply do not exist and future projections of some of the items may be of dubious guality. Also we are aware that some of the past data has been published already. Nevertheless in many cases it is difficult, if not impossible, to obtain consistent historical data extending back over a ten-year period. We assume that your own record systems will not be similarly limited. Therefore the Committee has instructed me to ask your Department to supply both the historical data and projections for the future covering a twenty year period in total - for those items where it is feasible to do so.

I should mention that as far as the historical data is concerned I am making the same request to the Central Statistical Office. As you may wish to co-ordinate with them I have enclosed a copy of the relevant letter.

I have also written to the Registrar General seeking demographic projections, and a copy of that letter is also enclosed for your information.

#### PUBLIC SECTOR DATA

On 24 May you wrote to Mr Wells in the CSO asking for a variety of public sector data for the last ten years and also to me in similar terms, with a request to extend the data ten years forward. Mr Wells acknowledged on 6 June and indicated there would be a joint CSO/Treasury response. We have now calculæted and assembled the figures which are readily available and I enclose them herewith.

2. Before commenting on individual table sections I should make a few general points.

3. We have two databases available to calculate the derived statistics you require:-

#### National accounts database

This is generally consistent with the figures published in the <u>National Income and Expenditure 1983 Edition</u> but includes some updating consistent with the June 1984 issues of <u>Financial Statistics</u> and <u>Economic Trends</u>. Where feasible the national accounts data have been



converted from calendar to financial years, covering the nine years 1974-75 to 1982-83 inclusive. Estimates for 1983-84, forecasts for the financial year 1984-85 and forecasts of constant price expenditure on goods and services up to mid-1985, were given in the Financial Statement and Budget Report (FSBR).

# Cmnd 9143 database

This is consistent with figures published in the most recent public expenditure White Paper (Cmnd 9143) and covers nine years 1978-79 to 1986-87 inclusive.

There are a number of definitional differences between the two databases. Those affecting overall totals are listed in Cmnd 9143, Part 5, paragraph 32; analyses by economic category are also affected by other differences of treatment. An overlap of five years is provided which will go some way to helping the Committee assess trends over the 13 year period 1974-75 to 1986-87.

4. The tables are arranged in two sets corresponding to the two databases. In both sets of tables, figures are expressed in cash (ie current prices), as well as real terms and percentage of GDP as specified by the Committee. This should aid references back to the source material. The CSO's national accounts tables are prefaced by a bibliography and list of sources. The Cmnd 9143 tables begin with an index and those tables expressed in cash indicate the source table in Cmnd 9143.

5. Analyses by programme are available only in the Cmnd 9143 data. Analyses by Department can eventually be derived from Cmnd 9143 data but considerable costs would have been incurred to have assembled the data in time to meet the Committee's deadline.

6. The totals for 1985-86 and 1986-87 in Sections II, III and IV exclude housing. No decisions have yet been taken in respect of those years on how the net housing programme total (see Table 2.7 of Cmnd 9143) should be split between capital and current. Nor about the likely level of capital receipts that would be added to the net capital provision to give the gross capital programme.

7. We do not have data on Cmnd 9143 definitions going back before 1978-79. This is because each Public Expenditure Survey covers five past years, the current year and three forward years. To take the historical figures back further requires a special exercise which we can only find resources to tackle occasionally. Fortunately, the last such exercise was as recent as November 1983, when a long series of generally consistent figures, some going back as far as 1963-64, were published in an article in Economic Trends, based on the definitions in the previous public expenditure White Paper (Cmnd 8789). Some comparisons with national accounts data were also published. An off-print of the article is included with this letter\*.

8. Data are not available to take the Cmnd 9143 series beyond 1986-87. The 1984 Public Expenditure Survey, now under way,

shifts the operational period one year forward - from 1979-80 to 1987-88. Figures for this period will be included in the next White Paper and details will be available early in 1985.

9. Notes on each table section

### I (value added)

These figures are available for past years and for calendar years only; information of this kind is not compiled as part of the public expenditure planning process.

### II (current expenditure on goods and services)

The CSO figures are expressed in calendar 1980 prices ie after deflating by the specific price indices the CSO uses to compile GDP in real terms. Comparable figures are not, of course, required in the public expenditure planning process; "real" terms in this context is cost terms ie deflated by the GDP deflator; Cmnd 9143 used 1982-83 as the base year (see Table 1.14, updated in the Official Report, 13 March, Cols 77-78).

# III (capital spending on goods and services)

The remarks about price indices under II also apply here. Gross has been interpreted as before deduction of asset sales. For the national accounts data, council house sales have been

identified. A breakdown between wages and procurement is not available.

The figures requested and provided are based on national accounts definitions and are not appropriate to assess the value of work supplied to the capital goods and construction industries by the public sector. Table 1.13 in Cmnd 9143 is more suitable for this purpose.

## IV (transfers)

The CSO does not have deflators for transfer payments and for this exercise have used the GDP deflator. Cmnd 9143 data in real terms are, of course, calculated similarly. As mentioned earlier different base years are used for the two data sets. // The Committee did not ask for data on net lending; in case this was overlooked we have supplied Cmnd 9143 figures separately under this heading, analysed by sector and programme; they exclude sales of company securities recorded under the 'special sales of assets' programme.

# V (employment)

Information for past years is available by sector and a broad analysis by service. We are not able to provide an analysis by skill and collar colour.

The government's forward plans for Civil Service manpower are detailed in Cmnd 9143-I, Table 1.15. A certain amount of information on armed forces manpower is included in the <u>Statement on Defence</u> <u>Estimates</u> (Cmnd 9227-I).

As to the NHS the Government has made clear that continued increases in productivity and efficiency in the NHS should lead to a rate of growth of resources services above that of / , and a rate of growth resources of / above that of manpower. There are detailed long-term forward projections of no NHS manpower, but the setting of manpower targets for health authorities is now integrated into the system of devising short-term programmes which cover services, all aspects of health authorities / including cost improvement as well as manpower.

No forward projections of nationalised industry manpower levels are published. The industries are responsible for their own manpower planning over which the Government does not exercise direct control. Any figures would necessarily be subject to considerable uncertainty, even in aggregate, depending upon individual industries' assumptions on future trading conditions, their financing and performance.

No forward projections of local authority manpower levels are published either. The central government does not directly control local government manpower. It can influence the level of local government manpower only through attempts to influence local authority current spending through the RSG system and,from 1985-86, rate capping. Any forecasts would therefore be subject to great uncertainty, requiring assumptions about future RSG settlements, local authority behaviour and the relationship between the two.

# VI (debt service)

The gross debt interest figures represent payments by the public sector to the private and overseas sectors. The definition of net debt interest used in the White Paper is explained on p164 of Cmnd 9143-II - it is designed to reflect that part of gross debt interest which must be met from taxation or further borrowing, and forms one component to be added to the planning total for the purpose of expressing public expenditure as a whole as a proportion of GDP (Cmnd 9143, Chart 1.8).

### VII (receipts)

The CSO figures are derived from the tables in Financial Statistics, and are consistent with the definition of general government receipts in the FSBR. Certain current receipts other

than taxes are shown. But in the table relating to general government, receipts and payments of interest within the sector are netted out, as are payments of current grants from central government to local authorities. The tables of figures expressed in real terms are shown in calendar 1980 prices, using the GDP deflator average measure. The same measure of GDP (at current market prices) is used to calculate the ratios in the final group of tables.

## VIII (cyclical aspects)

I regret that we have been unable to comply with this part of your request. Cyclical corrections would be very difficult to construct and the basis for constructing them rather arbitary; the cyclical behaviour of the public accounts depends on the nature of policy and the nature of the cycle. For example it would be necessary to make a cyclical correction to interest rates in order to arrive at cyclical adjustments to debt service and certain other expenditure and tax items, and to specify precisely the cyclical element of changes in income and expenditure patterns in order to assess cyclical effects on taxes. To do work of this kind would incur considerable costs and produce results of questionable value.

LONG TERM TRENDS IN RESOURCES AND PUBLIC EXPENDITURE: PUBLIC SECTOR DATA

In your letter of 24 May about the Committee's enquiry you asked for a variety of public sector data for the last ten years and extended ten years forward. You also wrote to the CSO in similar terms about the historical data. We have calculated and assembled the figures which are readily available and I enclose them herewith. They have been produced jointly with the CSO.

Before commenting on individual table sections there are a few general points to note.

We have two databases available to calculate the derived statistics the Committee requires:

#### National accounts database

This is generally consistent with the figures published in the <u>National Income and Expenditure 1983 Edition</u> but includes some updating consistent with the June 1984 issues of <u>Financial Statistics</u> and <u>Economic Trends</u>. Where feasible the national accounts data have been converted from calendar to financial years, covering the nine years 1974-75 to 1982-83 inclusive. Estimates for 1983-84, forecasts for the financial year 1984-85 and forecasts of constant price expenditure on goods and services up to mid-1985, were given in the Financial Statement and Budget Report (FSBR).

#### Cand 9143 database

This is consistent with the figures published in the most recent public expenditure White Paper (Cand 9143) and covers mine years 1978-79 to 1986-87 inclusive.

There are a number of definitional differences between the two databases. Those affecting overall totals are listed in Cmnd 9143, Part 5, paragraph 32; analyses by economic category are also affected by other differences of treatment. An overlap of five years is provided which goes some way to helping the Committee assess trends over the thirteen year period 1974-75 to 1986-87.

The tables are arranged in two sets corresponding to the two databases. In both sets of tables, figures are expressed in cash (i.e. current prices), as well as real terms and percentage of GDP as specified by the Committee. This should aid references back to the source material. The CSO's national accounts tables are prefaced by a bibliography and list of sources. The Cmnd 9143 tables begin with an index and those tables expressed in cash indicate the source table in 'Cmnd 9143.

Analyses by programme are available only in the Cmnd 9143 data. Analyses by Department can eventually be derived from Cmnd 9143 data but considerable costs would have been incurred to have assembled such data in time to meet the Committee's deadline.

The totals for 1985-86 and 1986-87 in Sections II, III and IV exclude housing. No decisions have yet been taken in respect of those years on how the net housing programme total (see Table 2.7 of Cmnd 9143) should be split between capital and current. Nor about the likely level of capital receipts that would be added to the net capital provision to give the gross capital programme.

We do not have data on Cmnd 9143 definitions going back before 1978-79. This is because each Public Expenditure Survey covers five past years, the current year and three forward years. A special exercise to take the figures back further was, however, undertaken last autumn. A long series of generally consistent figures, some going back as far as 1963-64, was published in an article in Economic Trends for November 1983. These figures were based on the definitions in the previous public expenditure White Paper (Cmnd 8789). Some comparisons with national accounts data were also published. An off-print of the article is included with this letter.

Data are not available to take the Cmnd 9143 series beyond 1986-87. The 1984 Public Expenditure Survey, now underway, shifts the operational period one year forward - from 1979-80 to 1987-88. Figures for this period will be included in the next White Paper and details will be available early in 1985.

#### Notes on each table section

#### I (value added)

These figures are available for the National Accounts Database only and for calendar years only; information of this kind is not compiled as part of the public expenditure planning process and therefore there are no equivalent tables in the Cmnd 9143 database.

# II (current expenditure on goods and services)

The CSO figures are expressed in calendar 1980 prices i.e. after deflating by the specific price indices the CSO uses to compile GDP in real terms. Comparable figures are not required in the public expenditure planning process, as "real" terms in this context is cost terms i.e. deflated by the GDP deflator; Cmnd 9143 used 1982-83 as the base year (see Table 1.14, updated in the Official Report, 13 March, 1984, Cols 77-78).

# III (capital spending on goods and services)

The remarks about price indices under II also apply here. "Gross" has been interpreted as before deduction of asset sales. For the national accounts data, council house sales have been identified. A breakdown between wages and procurement is not available.

The figures requested and provided are based on national accounts definitions and are not appropriate to assess the value of work supplied to the capital goods and construction industries by the public sector. Table 1.13 in Cmnd 9143 is more suitable for this purpose.

### IV (transfers)

The CSO does not have deflators for transfer payments and for this exercise have used the GDP deflator. Cmnd 9143 data in real terms are, of course, calculated similarly. As mentioned earlier, different base years are used for the two data sets.

The Committee did not ask for data on net lending; in case this was an oversight we have supplied Cmnd 9143 figures separately under this heading, analysed by sector and programme; they exclude sales of company securities recorded under the "special sales of assets" programme.

# V (employment)

Information for past years is available by sector and a broad analysis by service. We are not able to provide an analysis by skill and collar colour. The Government's forward plans for Civil Service manpower are detailed in Cmnd 9143-I, Table 1.15. Information on armed forces: manpower is included in the <u>Statement on Defence Estimates</u> (Cmnd 9227-I).

As for the NHS, the Government has made clear that continued increases in productivity and efficiency in the NHS should lead to a rate of growth of services above that of resources, and a rate of growth of resources above that of manpower. There are no detailed long-term forward projections of NHS manpower; but the setting of manpower targets for health authorities is now integrated into the system of devising short-term programmes which cover all aspects of health authorities' services including cost improvement as well as manpower. No forward projections of nationalised industry manpower levels are published. The industries are responsible for their own manpower planning over which the Government does not exercise direct control. Any figures would necessarily be subject to considerable uncertainty, even in aggregate, depending upon individual industries' assumptions on future trading conditions, their financing and performance.

The central government does not directly control local government manpower and no forward projections are published. Central government can influence the level of local government manpower only through attempts to influence local authority current spending through the RSG system and, from 1985-86, rate capping. Any forecasts would therefore be subject to great uncertainty, requiring assumptions about future RSG settments, local authority behaviour and the relationship between the two.

# VI (debt service)

The gross debt interest figures represent payments by the public sector to the private and overseas sectors. The definition of net debt interest used in the White Paper is explained on p164 of Cmnd 9143-II: it is designed to reflect that part of gross debt interest which must be met from taxation or further borrowing, and forms one component to be added to the planning total for the purpose of expressing public expenditure as a whole as a proportion of GDP (Cmnd 9143, Chart 1.8).

# VII (receipts)

The CSO figures are derived from the tables in Financial Statistics, and are consistent with the definition of general government receipts in the FSBR. Certain current receipts other than taxes are shown. But in the table relating to general government, receipts and payments of interest within the sector are netted out, as are payments of current grants from central government to local authorities. The bables of figures expressed in real terms are shown in calendar 1980 prices, using the GDP deflator average measure. The same measure of GDP (at current market prices) is used to calculate the ratios in the final group of tables.

### VIII (cyclical aspects)

I regret that we have been unable to comply with this part of the Committee's request. Cyclical corrections would be very difficult to construct and the basis for constructing them rather arbitrary; the cyclical behaviour of the public accounts depends on the nature of policy and the nature of the cycle. For example, it would be necessary to make a cyclical correction to interest rates in order to arrive at cyclical adjustments to debt service and certain other expenditure and tax items, and to specify precisely the cyclical element of changes in income and expenditure patterns in order to assess cyclical effects on taxes. Work of this kind, which would be very costly, would produce results of questionable value. Please let me know if the Committee would like any further explanation of the sources and methods used to compile these figures.
